Curriculum

Our curriculum is based on Common Core standards-based approaches incorporating differentiation and teacher-designed methodology. Some of the tools we employ in addition to the district curriculum include:

- Math Bridges Math, Singapore Math, Engage New York, and CMP3 (MS) as well as blended learning with online programs such as Khan Academy, Reflex and Math XL
- Literacy Benchmark, Expeditionary Learning, Engage New York, Lucy Calkins Writing, Guided Reading and LLI Interventions
- Social Studies/Science National Geographic, LDC and Amplify
- Orton-Gillingham multi-sensory approach to phonics instruction. Over 80% of our K-5 staff are trained in the Orton-Gillingham Approach to reading instruction.
- Spanish- Level I Spanish is required for our 7th and 8th grade students

Technology & SMART Lab

We have received over \$400,000 in tech grants in the past five years enabling us to install a Creative Learning Systems SMART Lab where technology works with the curriculum to support hands-on, minds-on learning. Our elementary students use iPads and/or Google Chromebooks and our Middle School was awarded the My Tech 1:1 Computer Initiative grant which provides all middle school students a Chromebook for school work. Our school also has one computer lab. We employ a tech professional to oversee our ongoing technology needs.

Our forward- thinking technology department is on the cutting edge of integrating technology into the classroom.

Electives

All students from ECE-5th grade participate in weekly special electives: Art, Drama, Music, Physical Education, SMART Lab and Library. Middle school students choose two electives per trimester from expanded offerings.

School Uniforms

We have a K-8 school-wide uniform/dress code. Elementary students can wear "Spirit Wear" on Fridays and middle school students can wear "Spirit Wear" every day. Uniforms help us develop a greater sense of pride and belonging on our school campus. They also help reduce the cost for parents, promote an academic approach to learning, help students resist peer pressure to purchase trendy clothes, and create a safer school.

Parents can purchase uniforms at the store of their choice, provided the items meet our requirements. Spirit Wear can be purchased through our school vendor, which can be found on our school website.

Campus Security

Bill Roberts E-8 has a full-time, unarmed security guard on site during school hours and the before/after school programs.

Our campus doors are locked at all times. The playgrounds are completely enclosed, and the ECE playground is configured for greater teacher visibility and child safety. All visitors are required to follow visitor check-in procedures during school hours.

Schedule

Our K-8 students attend school from 8:15 a.m.-3:15 p.m., Monday – Thursday and 8:15 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. on Fridays. Our early release Fridays allow our staff to participate in Professional Learning Communities. Through this unique opportunity, our staff is able to collaborate with colleagues, collect, analyze and interpret data, identify student needs and strengths to determine instructional strategies to improve student learning, and continue their professional development. We offer Discovery Link and Enrichments everyday including Fridays to help working parents.
