About the Play — Bad Books:

A worried mother comes to the library for what she believes will be a reasonable, polite discussion about which books are appropriate for her teenage son. But her confrontation with the town librarian—a woman deeply committed to her job and her community—sets off a chain reaction of consequences no one could have predicted. Equal parts heartbreakingly poignant and absurdly funny, *Bad Books* invites audiences to consider what it truly means to care for our children. It's a raucous and brash debate set against the quietest place in America... the library.

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E-Bike Safety As a reminder, we work hard to maintain a safe campus and encourage E-Bike Safety at all times. Officer Jackson is aware of our E-Bike Riders and has provided safety reminders for them- including wearing helmets and not “doubling-up” on the bikes. Reminder Snow Shenanigans Finally, we are getting snow! The kids are loving being allowed to play outside and in the snow (and it's fun seeing them so happy). In order to be safe, please reiterate the following points with your child(ren):

- Do not eat snow or ice - this could have been treated with ice melt which is dangerous!
- No throwing snowballs ... at anything. This inevitably turns into throwing snowballs at each other and someone can get hurt.
- Be extra careful and aware of ice!

Reminder Weather Delays In the event that there is a weather delay, here are some points to keep in mind:

- Morning school buses will run on a 2-hour delayed schedule and begin pick-ups at bus stops two hours later than the normal pick-up time. (Example: If you normally leave home at 7:45 a.m. for school, you would now depart at 9:45 a.m. to arrive at school on time.)
- If you have a scheduled Late Start on a Weather Delay day, you will default to your normal schedule. (ie Late Start 10am, Normal Bell Time 8:20- you will start at 10:20)
- Field Trips will be considered on an individual basis and if the field trip is serviceable.
- Balarat will occur only if the road to Balarat is passable
- Breakfast will still be served to students as they arrive at school.
- Afternoon school buses will run on a normal schedule

Reminder Shakespeare Festival In Shakespeare Club your child will learn who Shakespeare was, about his literary work, and perform different scenes from his two iconic plays: A Midsummer's Night Dream and Hamlet.
